

POLICE DEPARTMENT INFORMATION

Housed in modern up to date facilities, the police department serves the community through a number of traditional and progressive programs. The Patrol Division, by far, the largest unit in the department, is highly motivated and well trained. In addition, to routine duties, officers are responsible for markedly successful D.W.I. and speed enforcement programs. As an adjunct to these efforts, the Department has recently implemented a Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) program to remove drugged drivers from the roadways.

Equipped with state of the art equipment, such as mobile data terminals and portable defibrillators, the members of the patrol division are prepared to handle a wide variety of enforcement and safety issues.

The Community Outreach Resource and Education Division (C.O.R.E.) works with the community to resolve public safety issues and support quality-of-life programs. Among these are speed enforcement awareness, defensive driving, home security, seat belt safety, DARE programs and bicycle patrol.

The Juvenile and Adult Divisions of the Plainsboro Police Detective Bureau conduct investigations in several areas. These include adult and juvenile crimes, crime scene processing and arson investigation. Beyond investigative duties, the detectives support adolescents in the community with the juvenile crisis intervention and Project Pride Leadership Programs.

The Plainsboro Township Police Department is conducting their annual Citizen Police Academy in the fall of this year. It will be held once a week, on Tuesday evenings, from 7:00 p.m. to approximately 9:00 p.m. at the Plainsboro Municipal Building, 641 Plainsboro Road, Plainsboro, New Jersey. There will be 11 sessions beginning September 12, 2006, with graduation on November 21, 2006.

The program will offer the student a wide variety of law enforcement related topics including:

- Investigations and Forensics
- Traffic Safety and Enforcement
- Domestic Violence
- Crime Prevention
- Firearms
- DWI Enforcement
- Terrorism
- Police and Community Relations
- Homeland Security

The goal of the Citizen Police Academy is to foster and promote and understanding within the Township of the services offered and the challenges facing law enforcement agencies. This program also serves as a vehicle through which communication can be developed and promoted between law enforcement and the public.

The program is open to any Plainsboro Township resident 18 years or older. The applicant must have their own transportation to/from each session, and make a commitment to attend the classes.

Because of the importance of developing relationships in the community, there will be no cost for the program.
