**WHEREAS**, Greta Kiernan served on the Plainsboro Township Planning Board from January 2002 to October 2021, and also served on the Plainsboro Library Board of Trustees from June 2009 to October 2021, and;

**WHEREAS**, Greta also served on the Board of Directors of the Princeton Landing Homeowners Association and the Board of Directors of Preservation New Jersey, and;

**WHEREAS**, Greta was born in New York City, attended the Academy of the Holy Angels and Berkeley School of Business, and worked as a lobbyist for the League of Women Voters.

**WHEREAS**, Greta was elected to and served one term in the New Jersey General Assembly representing the 39<sup>th</sup> District which includes Bergen County.

**WHEREAS**, Greta continued her long career in government service as a staff member to a state Senate President, three State Senators, Assembly Majority Leader and three state Assembly members, and;

**WHEREAS**, Greta was the first person to serve as New Jersey Representative at the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey coordinating issues with the Governor's office, and;

**WHEREAS**, Greta also served as Legislative Liaison at the NJ Board of Public Utilities where she analyzed proposed legislation, testified before legislative committees and opened and managed the Trenton office;


**WHEREAS**, Greta also served Governors McGreevey, Cody and Corzine as Lead Creative Writer in the Office of Constituent Relations, and;

**WHEREAS**, Greta also worked at the NJ Department of Environmental Protection and was a Special Assistant to two Commissioners, and was Director of Legislative Policy, and;

**WHEREAS**, after retiring from government service Greta became a freelance creative consultant, writer, editor and Visiting Associate at the Eagleton Institute;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that after her more than thirty years of service to the State of New Jersey, Greta continued her efforts to implement sound public policy by serving Plainsboro Township as a volunteer citizen planner before resigning for health reasons in October 2021,

**AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT**, the Plainsboro Planning Board, does hereby proclaim its debt of gratitude to Greta Kiernan for her selfless devotion and long length of service to the people of the Township of Plainsboro.
